





Multilingual Program


- Multilingual staff push-in to core subjects to support students in each grade level and had individual grade small groups.

- Students also received Multilingual support during our WIN periods.

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

Goal 3: SEB - Office Referrals

- Teachers will be provided professional development on behavior regulation, de-escalation, and behavior management. Students will selfassess in PBIS Rewards their current thoughts and feelings.
- Students who are Identified as "at risk" will receive support from the mental health professionals.
- Second Step Program and Common Sense Digital Citizenship Curriculum Curriculums will be used to educate the students on what it means to be 'Giles Made'.
- Promote positive behaviors using PBIS points.
- Teach and reteach the PRIDE Building Matrix each trimester.
- During collaboration, student behavior data is reviewed and Behavior Improvement Plans are created.
- Families informed regarding classroom behaviors and discipline referrals.
- School Resource Officer to build relationships with students and families while supporting the school staff.
