

\$9.9 Million: 2011 Reserve Funds Balance

Special Ed. \$3.3





Increase in expenditures pertaining to special education and the LASEC program accounted for \$3.3 million of the reserve fund.

14% Increase in Student Enrollment

2011 to 2018 saw a 13.7% increase in student enrollment which led to a 25% increase in staffing. To maintain smaller class sizes, this increase resulted in adding additional staff and increasing cost of living expenses for established staff resulting in spending down reserves

Tracking the Reserve Funds

\$1.2 million in Operations & **Maintenance**

Expenditures, including a new roof for Leigh School, water mitigation at Giles School and other, state required life safety necessities which required repair due to aging buildings accounted for \$1.2 million of the reserve fund.



\$827k General Administration



Education, Support Services, Information Services and General Administration accounted for ~\$827k

Increase in Special Education Transportation and Municipal Retirement contributions accounted for ~\$206k.
