TRADITIONAL GRADING

Letter grades are calculated by averaging performance on assignments, tests, effort, homework, and/or expectations.

Student receives one letter grade for each subject.

Letter grades do not inform students or families which skills have been mastered or whether they are working at grade level.

STANDARDS BASED GRADING

Grading system that focusing on student learning of the Illinois State Standards.

Focus on learning targets and growth.

Progress of learning is based on the most recent evidence of learning, not average of all activities

It gives grades meaning and provides specific feedback.

It helps teachers adjust instruction to individuals.

Students focus on learning.

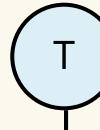

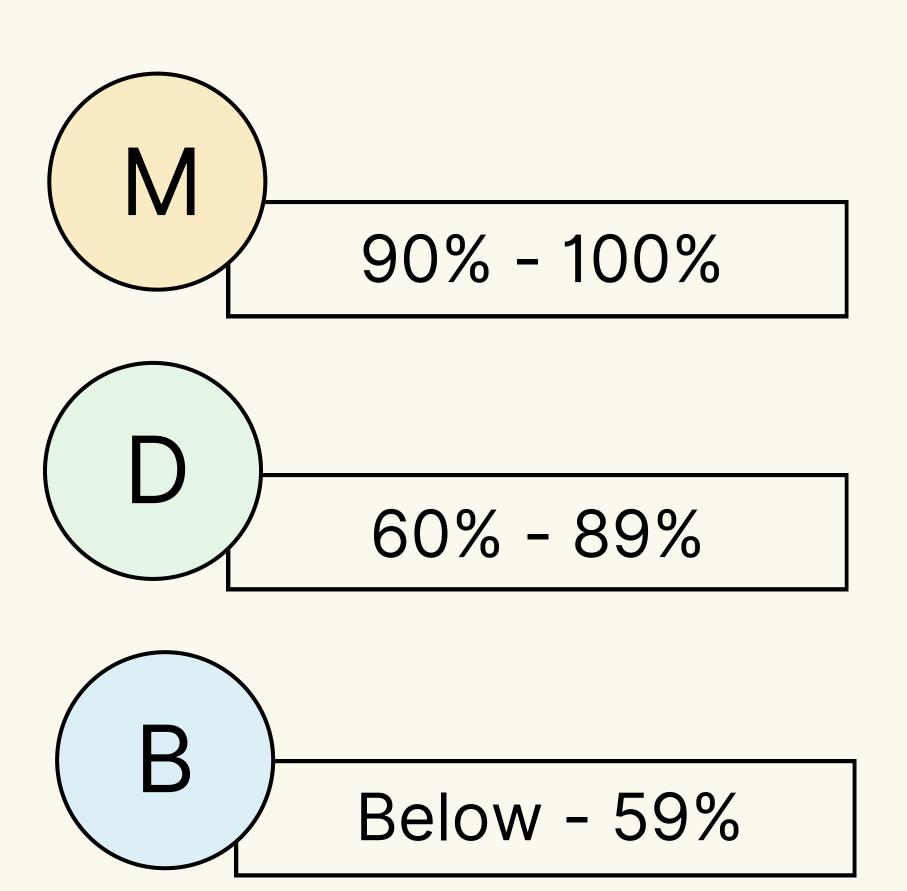

PRIORITY STANDARDS

Essential learning targets within a curriculum that are deemed most critical for student success.

These standards focus on the knowledge and skills that students must master to progress in a subject, succeed in subsequent grades, and apply learning in real-world contexts.

Focusing on priority standards provides clear expectations for students, and supports consistent, meaningful measurement of learning outcomes across classrooms.

UNPACK STANDARDS

Process of breaking down learning standards into specific, clear, and measurable learning goals.

Identifying the key concepts, skills, and understandings students must master, as well as the evidence needed to show proficiency.

By unpacking standards, teachers gain a deeper understanding of what the standard truly requires and can design instruction, assessments, and learning activities that directly align with those expectations.

This process ensures consistency across classrooms, supports differentiated instruction, and helps students clearly see what they are expected to learn and how they can demonstrate their progress toward mastery.

PROFICIENCY SCALES

Proficiency scales are tools that clearly outline what students need to know and be able to do at different levels of learning for each standard.

Progression of skills—from beginning to developing to mastery—so students, teachers, and parents can understand where a student currently stands and what the next steps are for growth.

By breaking standards into manageable, clearly defined levels, proficiency scales make expectations transparent and help guide instruction, feedback, and assessment.

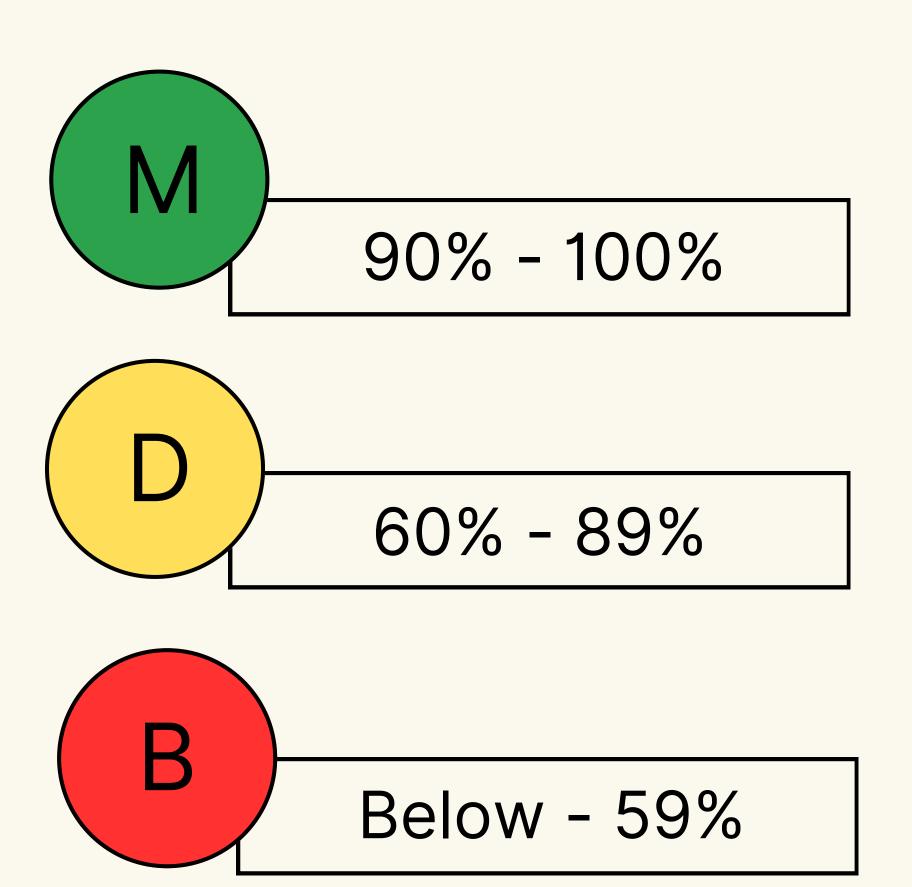
